Policy on the Use of Technology and Generative Artificial Intelligence

In GA and ECOSOC/RB committees at WorldMUN 2024, delegates may only use technology for the purpose of drafting working papers and draft resolutions during unmoderated caucuses. Delegates in these committees may also use technology during working paper and draft resolution presentations at the discretion of the chair. Delegates may not use technology in Crisis committees.

Delegates who: (1) plagiarize from online sources, (2) use generative AI (e.g., ChatGPT), (3) copy text from another bloc and/or other delegates for working papers and draft resolutions, (4) delete text from the working papers and draft resolutions of other blocs, or (5) prepare text for working papers and draft resolutions prior to the conference, will be precluded from winning an award, pending due process from their chair, the USG for Committees, and the Secretary-General.

Writing for working papers and draft resolutions should only occur **during** committee sessions.

We encourage all delegates who witness instances of plagiarism and/or foul play to report such incidents to their dias, or send an email to our USG for Delegate Relations, at delegate@worldmun.org.

Each delegate will be given a notepad and two pens during registration on March 10.
